

# Cron Logging

If Cron is seemingly not working, then we need to check the logs at </var/log/cron.log>. However by default logging in Cron is not enabled.

To enable Cron logs, from a command line enter:

```
sudo nano /etc/rsyslog.conf
```

Look for the line:

```
#cron.* and remove the #
```

Now restart rsyslog:

```
sudo /etc/init.d/rsyslog restart
```

After the next time your Cron job was due to run, you can check the log </var/log/cron.log>.

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
